| Research Interests | <p>We conduct research in the field of intergroup relations and political psychology. Our work focuses on the psychological mechanisms of prejudice, discrimination, collective action, and social change, with special attention to the situation of disadvantaged social groups, especially Roma communities in Hungary and Europe. We also examine attitudes toward immigrants and Muslims, the role of national identity, and the social consequences of exclusionary versus inclusive group norms.</p> <p>The research group combines basic and applied social psychological research methods, including surveys, experiments, interview studies and the secondary analysis of international databases. Current projects investigate how social and political contexts influence prejudice reduction, solidarity, civic engagement, and participation in social movements.</p> |
